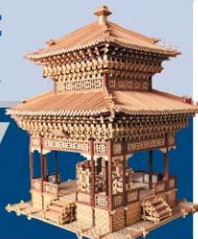

Logos for three major space missions in 2023 revealed

The China Manned Space Agency has revealed logos for three missions of China's manned space program this year — the launches of the cargo craft Tianshou 6, and the crewed spaceships Shenzhou XVI and Shenzhou XVII.

According to the CMSA, since the call out for logo designs on Feb 15, it has received more than 1,500 submissions from over 500 organizations and individuals across China.

After preliminary selection, online voting and final validation,



three logos, which were designed by Xiaobao Tian-gong Culture and Art (Beijing) Center, the

Beijing Institute of Space Science and Technology Information, and a postgraduate student at Sichuan Fine Arts Institute, were officially released.

The selected logos were well designed and filled with the best



wishes for China's space station. The logo of the Shenzhou XVI mission even incorporates the *kuw*, a

sacred animal from Chinese mythology, which flies extremely high, far and steadily.

It was the first open logo solicitation of China's manned space program, said the CMSA.

The Tianshou 6 cargo craft is



expected to launch in May. The Shenzhou XVI and Shenzhou XVII spaceships will launch in May

and October, respectively, and will dock with the space station to form a combination of three modules and three spaceships, according to an earlier announcement made by the CMSA.
