Euclid captures a space horse

This is the Horsehead nebula, which lies about 1375 light years from Earth in the Orion constellation. It has been captured in incredible detail by the European Space Agency's Euclid space telescope, which has sent back its first full-colour images. Data from Euclid will be used to create a 3D map of the cosmos to help us understand dark matter and dark energy.

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
